HOW DO I USE THE STEP-BY-STEP PLAN?

Great news that you decided to go to Train World. In collaboration with Train World, Tourism for Autism created a step-by-step plan to prepare for this activity.

Below you will find out how to use this step-by-step plan.



There is a lot of information in this step-by-step plan.

Not all of this information is important for everyone.

For example, you have different options for going to the museum. You can go by car, by train, by bike, on foot, etc.



You choose the pages that are relevant to you.

You choose which pages to print in the next phase.



You can write this down on a sheet of paper so you don't forget anything when you print.



After that, print the pages you selected in the previous step. You can also print the agreements, if you want to use them.



Once you have printed the step-by-step plan, it is best to keep it in a folder. That way, the pages won't get mixed up.

It's up to you whether you want to do this or not.




What's more, you need to complete some of the sentences yourself in the step-bystep plan.

For example, on the dotted line at the start, you fill in when you will go to the museum and who will go with you.

That way, you read the entire step-by-step plan and fill in all the dotted lines.

HOW DO I USE THE STEP-BY-STEP PLAN?



You will also see two clocks at the start of the step-by-step plan. You read what it says underneath and draw that time on the clock.



Now you can really start preparing for this day out.

Pick a quiet time so you are not in a hurry to read the step-by-step plan. You should read the step-by-step plan at the latest the night before you set off. Do this at least once. If you want, you can read the step-by-step plan sooner. You can also read the step-by-step plan several times.

It all depends on your own needs.



If this step-by-step plan is intended for young children, it is best to read it with them the first time

That way, you can be sure the child understands everything well and can ask any questions.



If you like, feel free to take this step-by-step plan with you to the museum. Although it's not essential for a successful visit.



So, now you're all prepared to head off.






We may leave a little bit later. But that's fine. Train World is in Schaerbeek.

BOOK TICKETS ONLINE




I can book my visit in advance via the Train World website.

I will print out this email or save it to my smartphone. I will take this email to Train World.


I can also buy an admission ticket at the Train World reception desk on the day I visit.



Buses 56, 58, 59 and 69 stop near Train World.

I will walk to the bus stop for bus(bus number).


I will get on the bus.

The journey takes approximately minutes.



I will get off at the 'Schaerbeek Station' stop.

Tram 7 and tram 92 stop near Train World.

I will walk to the tram stop for tram (tram number).

The journey takes approximately minutes.

I will get off at the 'Station Schaerbeek' stop.



I will get off at the 'Schaerbeek Station' stop.

I will go by car to Train World.



I can park in the paid car park next to the station building.

This car park is not that big.

If this car park is full, I can also always park at Docks Bruxsel.

It is a 7-minute walk to Train World from this car park.

I WILL GO BY BIKE




I will go by bike to Train World.

I can park my bike in the bike park in front of the museum.

ARRIVAL



I arrive at Train World.

I will recognise the building by the two orange flags at the entrance.



I will enter via the green door.



I am now in the entrance hall.



I will join the queue at the reception desk.

Other people may sometimes be queuing at the reception desk.

I will do my best to wait patiently.

If no one is queueing, I can go straight to the reception desk.



It's my turn.

I will show the email I received.

I can print out this email or show it on my smartphone. The attendant will check my ticket. `

My ticket is OK. OR

I buy a ticket at the reception desk.



I get a ticket to go inside. I will take good care of this ticket. I need it to enter the different buildings of the museum.

I continue through the opening on the right side of the hall.

ARRIVAL



I walk to the end of the corridor.

I go past the restaurant on the way.



I come to a sliding door.




I scan my ticket.

Now my visit to the museum can start.







There is a lot to see and do at Train World.



The museum is spread across 2 buildings.

I will take good care of my ticket, because I need it to enter every building.



I enter the exhibition hall in the first building via the glass door.

I am in the first exhibition hall.

It is a very large hall.

This hall is called the Large Ticket Office.



I can hear music playing in this hall.



I can see a help desk in front of me.

Some of the museum staff are at the desk.

They can help me with any questions.

I can also get a map of the museum from them.



This hall contains several scale models of historic train sets.

There are several small and large screens in this hall showing film clips.



There are authentic ticket counters in this hall.



There are information boards near the objects in the hall. I can read more about the objects on these information boards.



When I finish in this hall, I will follow the arrows that say 'Visit continues this way'.

To get to the second building, I have to go out through these doors at the end of the hall.



I will follow the path to the right.

Along the path are several machines used in stations and on the railways.



I keep walking until I reach this building.



I continue through the large opening.

I walk over metal planks.



Each person in my group scans their ticket again here to go through the turnstiles of the second building.




I will enter the building through the double doors.



I arrive in hall 1 of the second building.

There are 4 large halls in the second building. It is quite dark in the first three halls.

There is more light in the last hall.



In the dark halls, some objects are illuminated with bright spotlights.



In every hall, I can hear music playing and the sounds of trains and clinking of the barriers of the railway.

If I find this a bit overwhelming, I will put on headphones.

This is Hall 1.

The theme of Hall 1 is 'The Early Days'.

In this hall, I will learn more about the emergence of trains and railways.

I WILL VISIT TRAIN WORLD WITHOUT A GUIDE




Hall 1 consists of 2 floors.

There is a small upper floor.

I will enter on this floor.

I can go to the lower floor using the stairs or lift.



There are several trains on the lower floor.



I can have a look in some of the trains.

These trains have steps at the entrance of the train that is free.



Sometimes there may be other people on the train.

I will do my best to wait patiently until the train is free or there is room.



There is also a railway on the lower floor that I can walk over.

The railway tracks are underneath glass. It's OK to walk on this glass.



There are several interactive tasks in this hall.

I can touch the buttons and screens and follow the instructions.



When I'm finished in this hall, I follow the arrow to Hall 2.

To get to Hall 2, I go past a room with a lot of clocks. I can hear the clocks ticking.

I continue to Hall 2.



The theme in Hall 2 is 'From Steam to Electricity'. Here I will learn more about steam technology.

Again, I can hear lots of different train sounds in this hall.

I can also see fake smoke coming from the green train.

I can take a look around several trains in this hall.

If there are other people on the train, I will do my best to wait patiently.

There are several interactive tasks in this hall.

I can touch the buttons and screens and follow the instructions.



Once I am finished in Hall 2, I will move on to Hall 3.



This is Hall 3.

The theme in this hall is 'Of trains and people'.

In this hall, I will see a real railway cottage, learn about trains during the Second World War, and about how SNCB-NMBS started.



I can take a look around several trains in this hall.

If there are other people on the train, I will do my best to wait patiently.

There is also a real railway cottage in this hall.



I can take a look at this cottage.



There is a television in this cottage.

A film is being played on this television.



There is also an area in this hall that tells more about the history of trains during the Second World War.

This area is kind of hidden behind a black wall.



Via a short staircase, I can get to a mezzanine.



Via this mezzanine, I can get to Hall 4.



I arrive in Hall 4.

Hall 4 has much more light thanks to the large windows. The theme in Hall 4 is 'The Epic of Luxury Trains'.



I first see the toddler train.


Here young children can ride a toy train themselves.

A little further on is a small suspension bridge.

I can go and look at a train via this suspension bridge.



I can take a look around several trains in this hall.

If there are other people on the train, I will do my best to wait patiently.

There are different routes I can take in this hall. I can choose which route to take.



Via the bridge, I can go and look at a goods wagon.

I WILL VISIT TRAIN WORLD WITHOUT A GUIDE



When I am finished in this hall, I will go back through a narrow corridor past all the previous halls.



That means I can see the hall from a different perspective.



At the end of this corridor is a train simulator.



I can have a go to see what it's like to drive a train. On a large screen, I can see which tracks to follow.

Other people may be using the simulator. I will do my best to wait patiently until it's my turn.

I continue through a double door.



Behind this door is a small cinema room. A film is playing in this cinema room.

I can sit on a seat to watch the film.

I can watch the complete film or I can watch a part of the film.



When I've finished, I will continue through the next door;

I continue walking down the narrow corridor through the previous halls.



At the end, I arrive at the last hall. There are some recent trains here.



When I've finished, I will continue.



I take the stairs or the lift to the lower floor.

I arrive at the exit to Train World.

The museum shop is also here.

I WILL LISTEN TO THE AUDIO GUIDE VIA THE HERITAGE APP



In Train World, I can listen to an audio guide. All I need for this is my smartphone and the Heritage app.

I can download the Heritage app for free from the App Store or Google Play.



In Train World, I will see a number with three curved lines in various places.

That means I can use the audio guide here to find out more.



I click on the calculator in the Heritage app and enter the number for which I want more information.



The text will now automatically be read out loud.




I will visit Train World.

I will say that I have booked a guided tour. I will wait until the guide joins us.




There may be other people on the guided tour. That is my group.

My guided tour can start.




The guide gives explanations during the guided tour.




I will do my best to listen attentively.

On low-stimulus days, the lighting is adjusted and sounds are turned off.


Quiet corners are also set up in the museum.


IN BUILDING 2
